## 1 Implementation of International Cooperation

### ( 1 ) Technical Assistance

#### Foundation of appropriate organizational structures in the NPA

To promote active and effective international cooperation according to the Policy Initiatives for Promoting International Cooperation, which is established in September 2005, the National Police Agency (NPA) founded appropriate structures as follows.

(2nd phase)*

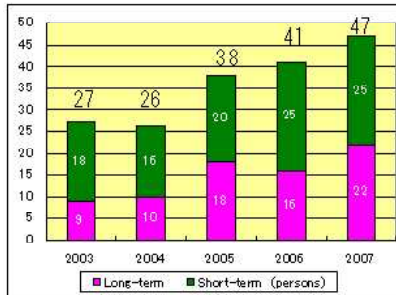


Activities of JICA experts in Indonesia

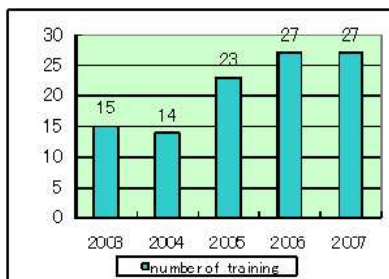
## Dispatch of experts and reception of trainees

### Dispatch of JICA experts

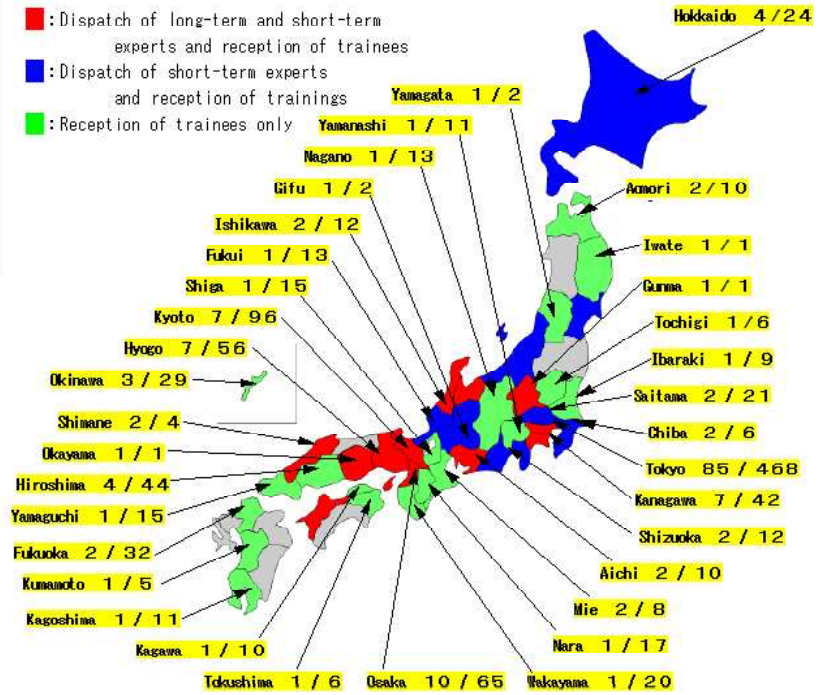


### Reception of JICA trainings

## (2) Civilian Police Activity

### Dispatch of police officials to PKO mission in East-Timor

The Japanese Police provides advice and guidance and conducts monitoring on police administration through activities such as the design and planning of police systems and education and training of police officials. This takes advantage of the distinct Japanese police features, which can be conducted by a relatively small number of dispatched police officials.

During the periods in below, the Japanese Police dispatched the total of 6 officials to East Timor so as to participate in the activities of the United Nations Integrated Mission in Timor-Leste (UNMIT).

## 2 Foundation of a Basis for Promoting International Cooperation

### ( 1 ) Reinforcement of Support for Overseas Officials

#### Introduction of a new training course

In 2006, NPA began "International Cooperation Training Course" for candidates of JICA experts. The graduates are engaged in the activities of international cooperation in foreign countries.

#### Commendation of dispatched officials

JICA experts, police officials engaged in PKO, and the members of JDR teams, were commended by senior officials of NPA.

### ( 2 ) Securance of Understanding and Cooperation for International Cooperation

#### Distribution of educational materials

NPA produced an audio-visual teaching material (DVD), "International Cooperation of the Japanese Police". It also publishes "The News of Police Activities in East Timor" and "The Activities of JICA Experts" for police officials.

### 3 Implementation of International Cooperation at the Local Police

#### ( 1 ) Reform of Attitudes to International Cooperation

##### Kanagawa Police, Shimane Police

Indonesian police officers participated in the trainings of martial art and the general classes of Recruits Training Course as a part of "Seminars on the Comparative Study of Police Systems for the Republic of Indonesia".

#### ( 2 ) Foundation of Appropriate Organizational Structures

##### Ishikawa Police

##### Osaka Police
