SUMMARY OF THE 8TH SPECIALIST GROUP MEETING ON CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

INTERPOL explained its efforts to deepen international and regional cooperation to prevent child sexual exploitation.

Mr. ISHIHAMA shared examples of measures to protect children against sexual exploitation, such as implementing age restrictions for account creation and chats within the services his company operates.

Osaka prefectural police presented the outline of investigations of sexual crimes and the production of child pornography, etc., and the modus operandi used by suspects in those cases to lure children.

Brave Movement Co-Founder/Former Head of Crimes Against Children - INTERPOL]

Mr. Shilling, as a co-founder of Brave Movement which is a global movement with a focus on survivors, presented activities to end childhood sexual violence.

e. Current Situation of Sexual Violence Victims (Survivors) and Support Efforts

Ms. YAMAMOTO explained how her activities as victim (survivor) of sexual violence, including lobbying the Diet and the government, led to the amendment of the Penal Code; she also explained the current situation of sexual violence victims in Japan, etc.
