(a) Effort of the doctor supporting the victims [Cocokara Women's Clinic]

Reported on the necessity of the sex education or how the communities for both of children and parents should be after explaining the social issues around the sexual problems of the children.

(b) Efforts of online game related association

Introduced the effort of online game related association such as functional measures, compliance and regulations of the rule, and educational activities for the children in order to enjoy a game without crime and trouble involved.
